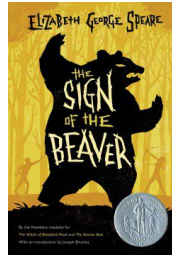

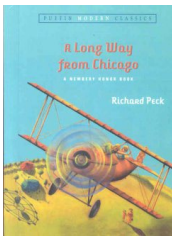

by Elizabeth George Speare

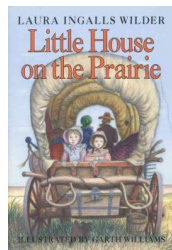

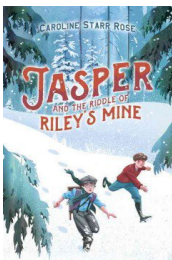

by Laura Ingalls Wilder

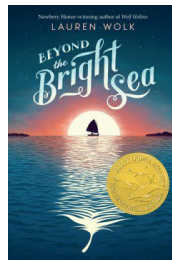

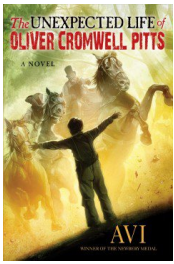

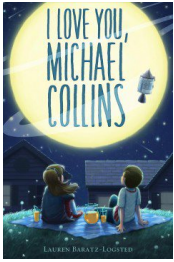


Whistling in the Dark

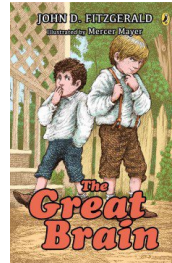


I Love You, Michael Collins

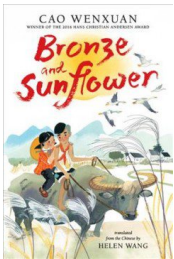


Midnight Without a Moon

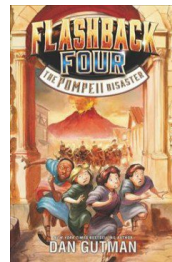


Bronze and Sunflower

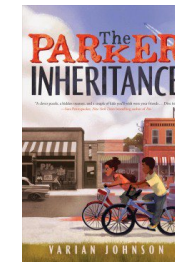


The Pompeii Disaster

Sent back in time to 79 AD, on a mission to photograph the eruption of Mount Vesuvius, the Flashback Four race to get their picture.

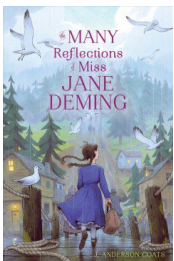


The Parker Inheritance

High-spirited Jane, who has been caring for a young sibling since her father's death, finds her grit and humor are her best attributes to meet the challenges in life.

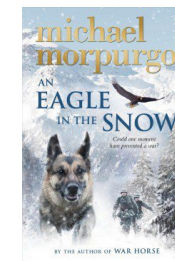


The Island at the End of Everything
