Youth Fiction Angleberger, Andrew The Strange Case of Origami Yoda Grades 4-6

Sixth-grader Tommy and his friends describe their interactions with a paper finger puppet of Yoda, worn by their weird classmate Dwight, as they try to figure out whether or not the puppet can

really predict the future. Includes instructions for making Origami Yoda.

Youth Fiction Applegate, Katherine Never Glue Your Friends to Chairs Grades 1-2

(Roscoe Riley Rules series)

When the first-graders' bee antennae would not stay on their heads and the drummers would not stay in their seats for the open house play, Roscoe decides to help by using the "don't-you-dare"

glue.

Youth Fiction Babbitt, Natalie The Moon Over High Street Grades 4-7

Struggling to make an important decision, Joe considers the advice of a successful, decisive

millionaire before finding help through an unexpected source.

Youth Fiction Barrows, Annie lvy + Bean Grades 1-3

When seven-year-old Bean plays a mean trick on her sister, she finds unexpected support for her

antics from Ivy, the new neighbor, who is less boring than Bean first suspected.

Youth Fiction Bateson, Catherine Being Bee Grades 4-6

Bee faces friction at home and at school when her widowed father begins seriously dating Jazzi, who seems to take over the house and their lives, but as shared secrets and common interests

finally begin to draw them together, Jazzi accidentally makes a terrible mistake.

Youth Fiction Bauer, Joan Stand Tall Grades 5-7

Tree, a six-foot-three-inch twelve-year-old, copes with his parents' recent divorce and his failure as an athlete by helping his grandfather, a Vietnam vet and recent amputee, and Sophie, a new girl at

school.

Newbery Bauer, Joan **Hope was Here** Grades 6-9

When sixteen-year-old Hope and the aunt who has raised her move from Brooklyn to Mulhoney, Wisconsin, to work as waitress and cook in the Welcome Stairways diner, they become involved

with the diner owner's political campaign to oust the town's corrupt mayor.

Youth Fiction Birdsall, Jeanne The Penderwicks Series Grades 4-6

While vacationing with their widowed father in the Berkshire Mountains, four lovable sisters, ages four through twelve, share adventures with a local boy, much to the dismay of his snobbish

mother.

Youth Fiction Blume, Judy Tales of a Fourth Grade Nothing Grades 3-6

Peter finds his demanding two-year-old brother an ever increasing problem.

Youth Fiction Bruchac, Joseph The Heart of a Chief Grades 5-8 An eleven-year-old Penacook Indian boy living on a reservation faces his father's alcoholism, a controversy surrounding plans for a casino on a tribal island, and insensitivity toward Native Americans in his school and nearby town. Youth Fiction Buyea, Rob Grades 4-6 **Because of Mr. Terupt** Seven fifth-graders at Snow Hill School in Connecticut relate how their lives are changed for the better by "rookie teacher" Mr. Terupt. Youth Fiction Cleary, Beverly **Henry Huggins** Grades 3-5 When Henry adopts Ribsy, a dog of no particular breed, humorous adventures follow. Youth Fiction Clements, Andrew Fear Itself Grades 3-5 As the new Keepers of the School, sixth-graders Ben and Jill must decipher a handful of clues written as maritime riddles to save their school from demolition by a greedy company. Youth Fiction Clements, Andrew No Talking Grades 4-6 The noisy fifth grade boys of Laketon Elementary School challenge the equally loud fifth grade girls to a "no talking" contest. Youth Fiction **Trouble-Maker** Grades 4-6 Clements, Andrew When his older brother gets in serious trouble, sixth-grader Clay decides to change his own mischief-making ways, but he cannot seem to shake his reputation as a troublemaker. Youth Fiction Connor, Leslie **Waiting for Normal** Grades 6-8 Twelve-year-old Addie tries to cope with her mother's erratic behavior and being separated from her beloved stepfather and half-sisters when she and her mother go to live in a small trailer by the railroad tracks on the outskirts of Schenectady, New York. Newbery DiCamillo, Kate **Because of Winn Dixie** Grades 4-6 Ten-year-old India Opal Buloni describes her first summer in the town of Naomi, Florida, and all the good things that happen to her because of her big ugly dog Winn-Dixie. Youth Fiction DiCamillo, Kate Bink & Gollie Grades 1-3 Two roller-skating best friends--one tiny, one tall--share three comical adventures involving outrageously bright socks, an impromptu trek to the Andes, and a most unlikely marvelous

Youth Fiction Draper, Sharon Out of My Mind: a Novel Grades 4-6

Considered by many to be mentally retarded, a brilliant, impatient fifth-grader with cerebral palsy

discovers a technological device that will allow her to speak for the first time.

Youth Fiction Gantos, Jack Jack's Black Book Grades 5-7

Comic misadventures ensue when seventh-grader Jack tries to write the great American novel.

Newbery Giff, Patricia Reilly **Pictures of Hollis Woods** Grades 5-7

A troublesome twelve-year-old orphan, staying with an elderly artist who needs her, remembers the only other time she was happy in a foster home, with a family that truly seemed to care about

her.

Youth Fiction Gifford, Peggy Elizabeth Moxy Maxwell Does Not Love Practicing the Piano Grades 3-5

On the day of her recital, ten-year-old Moxy prepares in her usual flamboyant way, which creates

chaos at home.

Youth Fiction Gorman, Carol Dork on the Run Grades 3-6

Having reluctantly agreed to run for sixth-grade president, Jerry, who has been trying to change his

image as a dork, finds his opponent playing dirty tricks on him.

Youth Fiction Greenwald, Tommy Charlie Joe Jackson's Guide to Summer Vacation Grades 4-7

The lovable slacker Charlie Joe Jackson is back, and he's wreaking havoc at an academic summer

camp.

Youth Fiction Hamilton, Virginia Bluish Grades 4-7

Ten-year-old Dreenie feels both intrigued and frightened when she thinks about the girl nicknamed

Bluish, whose leukemia is making her pale and causing her to use a wheelchair.

Youth Fiction Henke, Kevin Bird Lake Moon Grades 4-7

Twelve-year-old Mitch and his mother are spending the summer with his grandparents at Bird Lake after his parents separate, and ten-year-old Spencer and his family have returned to the lake where Spencer's little brother drowned long ago, and as the boys become friends and spend time

together, each of them begins to heal.

Newbery Henry, Marguerite **Misty of Chincoteague** Grades 2-4

The determination of two youngsters to win a Chincoteague pony is greatly increased when the

Phantom and her colt are among those rounded up for the yearly auction.

Youth Fiction Hermes, Patricia Emma Dilemma Grade 2-4

Emma tries to help her parents understand that, although their beloved new nanny has made a few

mistakes, no one can behave perfectly responsibly all the time.

Newbery Hiaasen, Carl **Hoot** Grades 6-9

Roy, who is new to his small Florida community, becomes involved in another boy's attempt to

save a colony of burrowing owls from a proposed construction site.

Youth Fiction Hobbs, Valerie The Last Best Days of Summer Grades 5-8

During a summer visit, twelve-year-old Lucy must come to terms with both her grandmother's failing memory and how her mentally-challenged neighbor will impact her popularity when both

enter the same middle school in the fall.

Youth Fiction Holt, Kimberley Willis Piper Reed: Navy Brat Grades 3-5

Piper is sad about leaving her home and friends behind when her father, a Navy aircraft mechanic, is transferred yet again, but with help from her often-annoying sisters and a surprise from their

parents, she finds happiness in their new home in Pensacola, Florida.

Newbery Horvath, Polly **Everything on a Waffle** Grades 4-7

Eleven-year-old Primrose living in a small fishing village in British Columbia recounts her experiences and all that she learns about human nature and the unpredictability of life in the

months after her parents are lost at sea.

Youth Fiction Kinney, Jeff Diary of a Wimpy Kid Series Grades 4-8

Greg records his sixth grade experiences in a middle school where he and his best friend, Rowley, undersized weaklings amid boys who need to shave twice daily, hope just to survive, but when Rowley grows more popular, Greg must take drastic measures to save their friendship.

Newbery Konigsburg, E.L. **The View from Saturday** Grades 4-6

Four students, with their own individual stories, develop a special bond and attract the attention of their teacher, a paraplegic, who choses them to represent their sixth-grade class in the Academic

Bowl competition.

Youth Fiction Korman, Gordon No More Dead Dogs Grades 5-7

Eighth-grade football hero Wallace is sentenced to detention attending rehearsals of the school play where, in spite of himself, he becomes wrapped up in the production and begins to suggest changes that improve not only the play but his life as well.

Newbery Lai, Thanhha Inside Out and Back Again Grades 4-6

Through a series of poems, a young girl chronicles the life-changing year of 1975, when she, her

mother, and her brothers leave Vietnam and resettle in Alabama.

Newbery Lord, Cynthia **Rules** Grades 4-7

Frustrated at life with an autistic brother, twelve-year-old Catherine longs for a normal existence

but her world is further complicated by a friendship with a young paraplegic.

Youth Fiction MacLachlan, Patricia Word after Word after Word Grades 2-4

A visiting author teaches five friends about the power of words and writing.

Youth Fiction Messner, Kate Capture the Flag Grades 4-6

When the original Star Spangled Banner is stolen, seventh-graders Anne, José, and Henry, all descendants of the Silver Jaguar Society, pursue suspects on airport carts and through baggage

handling tunnels while stranded at a Washington, D.C., airport during a snowstorm.

Youth Fiction Nichols, Sally Ways to Live Forever Grades 4-6

Eleven-year-old Sam McQueen, who has leukemia, writes a book during the last three months of his life. He tells about what he would like to accomplish, how he feels, and things that have happened to him.

Youth Fiction O'Connor, Barbara The Small Adventure of Popeye & Elvis Grades 3-6

In Fayette, South Carolina, the highlight of Popeye's summer is learning vocabulary words with his grandmother until a motor home gets stuck nearby and Elvis, the oldest boy living inside, joins Popeye in finding the source of strange boats floating down the creek.

Youth Fiction Palacio, R.J. Wonder Grades 4-7

Ten-year-old Auggie Pullman, who was born with extreme facial abnormalities and was not expected to survive, goes from being home-schooled to entering fifth grade at a private middle school in Manhattan, which entails enduring the taunting and fear of his classmates as he struggles to be seen as just another student.

Youth Fiction Parry, Rosanne Heart of a Shepherd Grades 4-7

Ignatius "Brother" Alderman, nearly twelve, promises to help his grandparents keep the family's Oregon ranch the same while his brothers are away and his father is deployed to Iraq, but as he comes to accept the inevitability of change, he also sees the man he is meant to be.

Newbery Paterson, Katherine **The Great Gilly Hopkins** Grades 4-6

An eleven-year-old foster child tries to cope with her longings and fears as she schemes against everyone who tries to be friendly.

Newbery Patron, Susan The Higher Power of Lucky Grades 4-6

Fearing that her legal guardian plans to abandon her to return to France, ten-year-old aspiring scientist Lucky Trimble determines to run away while also continuing to seek the Higher Power that will bring stability to her life.

Youth Fiction Paulson, Gary Lawn Boy Grades 4-7

Things get out of hand for a twelve-year-old boy when a neighbor convinces him to expand his summer lawn mowing business.

Youth Fiction Pennypacker, Sara Clementine Grades 2-4

While sorting through difficulties in her friendship with her neighbor Margaret, eight-year-old Clementine gains several unique hairstyles while also helping her father in his efforts to banish pigeons from the front of their apartment building.

Newbery Perkins, Lynne Rae Criss Cross Grades 6-9

Teenagers in a small town in the 1960s experience new thoughts and feelings, question their identities, connect, and disconnect as they search for the meaning of life and love.

Youth Fiction Roberts, Willo **Rebel** Grades 6-8

When her grandmother decides to ditch assisted living and start a boarding house, fourteen-yearold Amanda Jane Keeling, or Rebel, signs on for the work crew, where she just happens to meet a teenaged boy taller than she is and to embroil them both in a mystery. Youth Fiction Russell, Rachel Renée **Dork Diaries: Tales from a Not-So-Fabulous Life** Grades 5-8

Fourteen-year-old Nikki Maxwell writes in her diary of her struggle to be popular at her exclusive new private school, then of finding her place after she gives up on being part of the elite group.

Newbery Rylant, Cynthia **Missing May** Grades 5-8

After the death of the beloved aunt who has raised her, twelve-year-old Summer and her uncle Ob leave their West Virginia trailer in search of the strength to go on living.

Youth Fiction Sachar, Louis Small Steps Grades 5-8

Three years after being released from Camp Green Lake, Armpit is trying hard to keep his life on track, but when his old pal X-Ray shows up with a tempting plan to make some easy money scalping concert tickets, Armpit reluctantly goes along.

Youth Fiction Sachs, Marilyn The Four Ugly Cats in Apartment 3D Grades 3-4

After a neighbor in her apartment building dies, ten-year-old Lily tries to find homes for his four

ugly, noisy cats.

Youth Fiction Smith, Yeardley I, Lorelei Grades 5-6

In letters to her recently deceased cat Mud, eleven-year-old Lorelei chronicles the ups and downs of her sixth-grade year, during which her parents separate, she gets a part in the school play, and she becomes friends with the cutest boy in her grade.

Youth Fiction Stead, Rebecca Liar and Spy Grades 5-8

Seventh-grader Georges adjusts to moving from a house to an apartment, his father's efforts to start a new business, his mother's extra shifts as a nurse, being picked on at school, and Safer, a boy who wants his help spying on another resident of their building.

Youth Fiction Sternberg, Julie Like Pickle Juice on a Cookie Grades 2-4

When nine-year-old Eleanor's beloved babysitter Bibi moves away to care for her ailing father, Eleanor must spend the summer adjusting to a new babysitter while mourning the loss of her old

one.

Youth Fiction Urban, Linda A Crooked Kind of Perfect Grades 4-6

Ten-year-old Zoe Elias, who longs to play the piano but must resign herself to learning the organ, instead, finds that her musicianship has a positive impact on her workaholic mother, her jittery father, and her school social life.

Youth Series Winkler, Henry I Got a "D" in Salami (Hank Zipzer series) Grades 3-5

Antics ensue after Hank throws his report card into a meat grinder.

Youth Fiction Yee, Lisa Stanford Wong Flunks Grades 5-7

After flunking sixth-grade English, basketball prodigy Stanford Wong must struggle to pass his summer-school class, keep his failure a secret from his friends, and satisfy his academically demanding father.
